We're excited to welcome students to Summer School and would like to share a few reminders to help families prepare for the first day.

DATES & TIMES

- Term 1: June 16 – July 3, 2025
- July 4 – No Summer School
- Term 2: July 7 – July 24, 2025
- July 24 – Last day of Summer School
- Class Times: Two classes each term, from 8:00 – 9:55 a.m. and 10:05 a.m. – 12:00 p.m., Monday - Thursday,
- **No Summer School Classes on Fridays this year**

CONFIRM SCHEDULE & ROOM NUMBERS

Please log in to your online [Family Access account](#), select the *Schedule* tab on the left, then scroll to the bottom of the page to confirm your schedule and classroom numbers before the first day of Summer School. A map with room numbers and class names is attached to help you.

CLASSES WITH EARLY & LATE START DATES

There are a few Summer School classes that begin before or after the traditional Summer School dates or are hosted at a different location. Please note these unique dates and locations if your child is registered for one of these classes.

- WEB (Where Everyone Belongs) for Nature Hill Students: August 11 at Nature Hill Intermediate

WHAT TO BRING

Students should bring a water bottle and a snack to Summer School each day, along with a lightweight bag to carry these items. Students will spend time outside each day so please also apply sunscreen before arriving at Summer School if you would like your child to wear it.

STUDENT CELL PHONE USE AT SUMMER SCHOOL

Students will be required to silence their phones during summer school and keep them in their bags or backpacks. Cell phone use will not be permitted during Summer School.

A student who uses a cell phone during Summer School will be asked to give the phone to the classroom teacher until the end of class. If a student uses a cell phone a second time during class, the phone will be given to the front office until the end of class. If a student uses a cell phone a third time during class, a parent or guardian will be contacted to come to school and pick up the phone.

DROP OFF & PICK UP

Location & Traffic Pattern

- The Main Entrance will be the only entrance to Summer School at Nature Hill Intermediate.
- The attached map shows the entrance location and traffic patterns.

Drop Off Process

- Students attending the 8:00 a.m. class can be dropped off no earlier than 7:45 a.m.
 - Families should drop students off at the front curb or the front parking lot only, not the staff parking lot.
 - After being dropped off, kids will walk to the playground to meet their teacher, then enter school as a class.
- There is no supervision for students or access to the school before 7:45 a.m.
- Students arriving for the 10:05 a.m. class can be dropped off no earlier than 9:55 a.m.
 - Families should drop students off at the front curb or the front parking lot only, not the staff parking lot.
 - After being dropped off, kids can enter the school and go directly to their classroom.
- Staff members will be outside at drop-off to assist students from the car line into the school. Staff members will also have class rosters to help kids find their teacher or classroom.

Pick Up Process

- Students attending only the 8:00 a.m. class must be picked up no later than 10:05 a.m. each day.
- Students attending the 10:05 a.m. class must be picked up no later than 12:10 p.m. each day.
- Students will leave the building through the main entrance, and families should use the front curb or front parking lot for pick up, not the staff parking lot.
- Staff members will be outside at pick-up to assist students into vehicles.

Road Closure Near Nature Hill

- Lapham Street is closed for pavement replacement between Lisbon Street and Lake Drive. Please follow detour signs if this closure impacts your route.

NUT FREE AT SUMMER SCHOOL

To protect the safety of all students, Summer School will be nut free. Please read the attached letter for more information on our nut free school guidelines.

STUDENT MEDICATIONS AT SUMMER SCHOOL

Students who require medications during Summer School should drop off medications and forms at the school health room on the first day of class. If your child had an OASD care plan during the 2025-26 school year, that care plan will be utilized for Summer School, and new forms are not needed. If your child does not have a care plan or medication forms, please visit our [Health & Immunization Forms web page](#) for detailed information and links to the required medication forms.

ATTENDANCE & ILLNESS GUIDELINES

Students are expected to attend Summer School each day unless they are ill. Based on the OASD Illness Guidelines, students and staff who are ill must stay home from Summer School. Families are expected to call the Summer School attendance line to report an absence due to vacation or illness and provide information on the illness and symptoms. 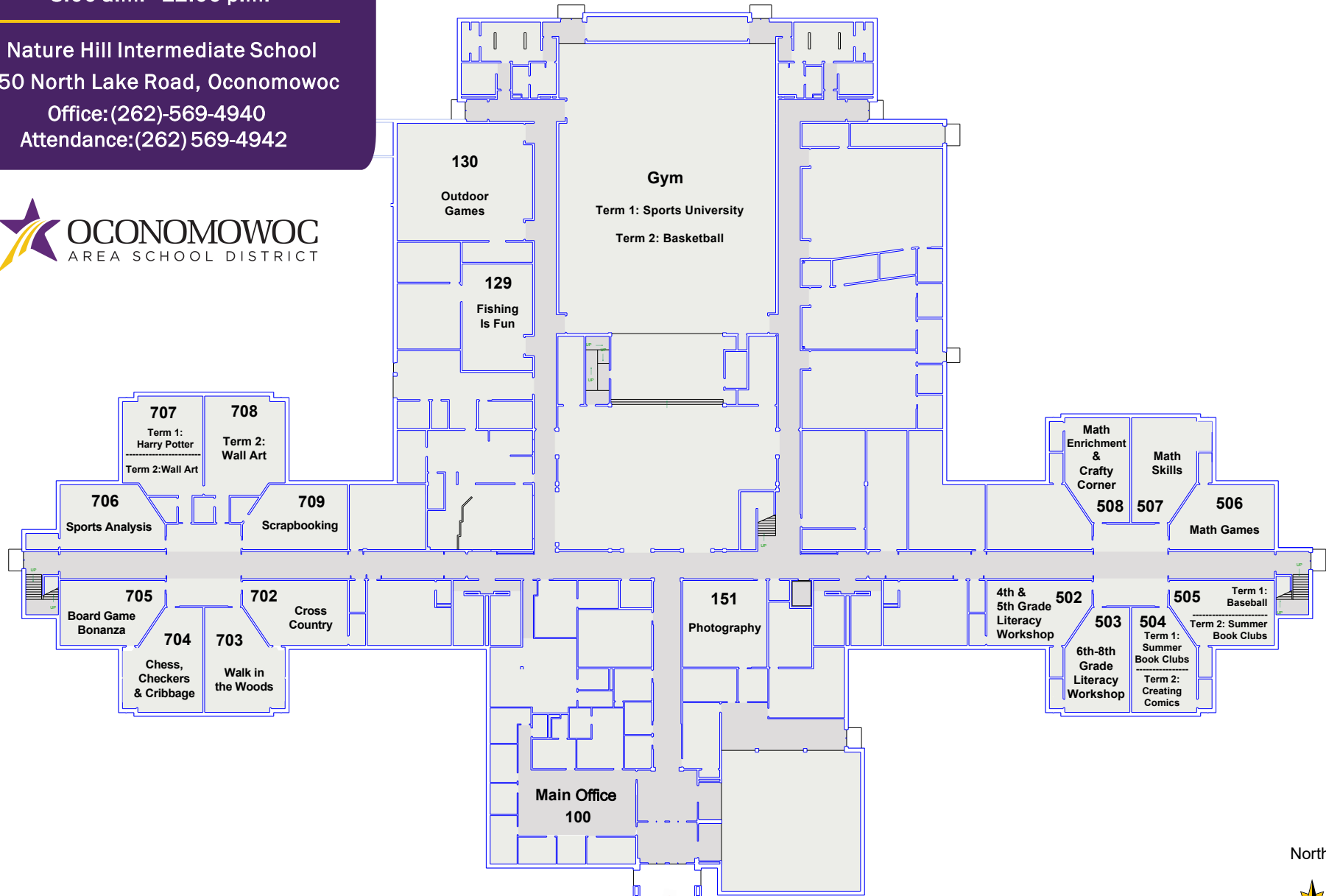

Summer School 2025

Dear Parent/Guardian,

For the safety of all students, our classrooms and learning spaces throughout OASD will be **PEANUT AND NUT-FREE*** environments. Please do not send your child with any snacks, treats, or products to be consumed in the classroom that contain Peanuts/Tree Nuts or are processed in a facility that processes Peanuts/Tree Nuts. Please also encourage your student(s) to wash or wipe their hands if coming in contact with nut products prior to coming to school.

We appreciate your support of these procedures to maintain a safe and healthy environment for all of our students. Peanuts and Tree Nuts are among the top 8 allergens, and are legally required to be listed plainly on a product ingredient label. Items labeled with statements saying they “may contain” these allergens or “processed in facility that also processes” are also not considered safe for classroom/learning environments. Manufacturers may change ingredients at any time. To be sure an item still is safe for school, please review the label prior to sending with your student.
