NEW UPDATES

OASD Outdoor Facilities Re-Open to the Community

At the June 9 OASD Special School Board meeting, school board members participated in a discussion around opening OASD school outdoor playgrounds and athletic fields for community use. The board approved the re-opening of District outdoor playgrounds and athletic fields for community use as of June 10. Community groups using or renting OASD outdoor spaces are asked to follow state and local health department group size recommendations of no more than 100 people, and ensure social distancing is being done.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Wisconsin public school districts are mandated to keep buildings closed until June 30. The OASD will follow guidelines from national, state, and local health department organizations to begin phasing the opening of District buildings throughout July and August.

OHS Athletic Camps

As of June 10, all OHS Athletic Camps scheduled in June have been canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This includes:

- Basketball (boys): scheduled for June 22-25
- Basketball (girls): scheduled for June 15-18
- Volleyball (boys & girls): scheduled for June 15-18

District and community families who have registered their children for July and August summer athletic camps at the high school will be notified at the end of June, whether state and local health department guidelines will allow July and August camps to proceed. OASD will issue refunds to all camps that are unable to run as scheduled.

OASD 2020-21 School Year Fall Planning

The OASD does not know what lies ahead with the COVID-19 pandemic, but District leadership is working together with the School Board to make decisions based on the most current guidance. The OASD will craft health and safety requirements based on what will best serve our students, staff, and community.

At an OASD Special School Board meeting on June 9, the school board, along with District leadership, began discussions, planning, and direction for the 2020-21 school year. The discussion that took place between school board members and District leaders will help District leaders to continue planning.

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In general, there are three planning scenarios that will continue for student return in the fall:

1. **Full face-to-face:** We would love to have all students back in their classrooms with their teachers. If health and safety conditions and space allow for this, we will be ready for this option.
2. **Hybrid blend of virtual and in-person learning:** This scenario can take different forms. As much as possible, we want students to learn from their teachers in classrooms. Again, health and safety conditions will determine how much in class and how much virtual learning will be required.
3. **Full virtual learning:** This scenario would be implemented only if mandated by the state, country, or even locally. If it is determined that face-to-face instruction would be unwise- either for the start of school or after the year begins- we need to be prepared. This virtual scenario would provide learning activities and virtual tools that are different than those experienced in our emergency remote learning this spring. Also, we are planning to offer a full virtual option for those families who want or need it, even if we find ourselves in scenario one or two.

Your feedback will continue to be important as the District moves through the planning process. We have surveyed families on their experiences with emergency remote instruction as well as completed surveys of all staff and students in grades 5-12. **You will be asked for additional feedback on return scenarios in a Family Preference Survey that will be emailed to you on June 12. That feedback will guide our decision making and results will be shared during community Fall 2020 return plan presentations during the week of July 13.**
